FILM INTRODUCTION

The exciting and moving family story with a happy ending, amplified by David Bowie's song "Heroes," inspires and appeals to viewers of all age groups, creating emotional connectivity with the characters, who are accessible and authentic. "Big Dreams - Children of Nagano" is an authentic, inspiring, emotional, family movie that captivates with its universal message, making it attractive for a wide family audience.

MOVIE CONTENT

In 1998, the Olympic ice hockey tournament of the century is peaking in Nagano, Japan. The whole Czech Republic is watching the games of the Czech team on TV, including teachers, who are watching TV with the students directly in the classrooms.

The victory of the Czech team sparks collective madness, joy and a revival of national pride. Small children dream of becoming the next Jaromír Jágr or Dominik Hašek. Among them is eleven-year-old Dom. An eleven-year-old dreamer and sadly a boy from a broken family. He looks up to his idol, the famous ice hockey goalie Dominik Hašek, and dreams of becoming just like him.

At the beginning of the summer, Dom announces his wish to his family. His stepfather, who has always strongly preferred his own son, mocks him. Dom's mother explains to him that they do not have enough finances to buy the equipment or to drive him to the ice rink. Both also doubt Dom's abilities not only in sports but also in school, where Dom is not performing well.

Despite these obstacles, Dom does not give up on his dream. After the advice and great support received from his grandfather, Dom with his friend Honza, forms a street hockey team made up of heterogeneous and similarly underestimated children. They name it "Sabres", just like Hašek's home club in Buffalo. With a tennis ball and poor-quality hockey sticks, without gear or experience, they begin to play hockey on the street. Initially lacking self-confidence, the team has only one dream - to defeat the older arrogant boys from the neighboring village who bully Dom and other children, not only in school.

After an initial debacle and disappointment, the team avoids falling apart thanks to Karel, who is Honza's father and also a former professional hockey player. Coach Karel delivers one of the main messages of the movie to the children: "No one is more than the team." During the training with Karel, the children gradually realize that team cooperation is key not only in sports but in life in general. Because of this, they support each other in solving problems at home and in school, preparing for the rematch with the bullies.

The decisive confrontation is full of emotions, tension, surprising twists, and authenticity. The spectators and Dom's parents know that this village match means much more than just a game. It's about victory, about respect, and also about the first kiss from a classmate. "Big Dreams - Children of Nagano" is a film that connects generations and offers a universal story about growing up, friendship, and fulfilling dreams.



THE MAIN SONG OF THE MOVIE

The main song of the film is the world-famous song HEROES by David Bowie. The role of this song was key for the creators of the film "Children of Nagano". According to the director and screenwriter Dan Pánek, the song "Heroes" is an integral part of the film "Children of Nagano".

"This track has accompanied me from the very beginning of writing the script to everyday filming," Pánek describes. "Paradoxically, even though it's just a sports event, from a certain perspective it's one of the important milestones of the 20th century. The period around Nagano was actually the only period since the 1989 revolution when the whole nation was truly together," says the famous Czech singer Vojtěch Dyk, who recorded a new version of the song "Heroes". Two days after the film's premiere, Universal also released the entire soundtrack of Children of Nagano.

MAIN CHARACTERS AND THEIR STORY



DOM

11 years old is an outsider, underrated at home with academic issues at school. He lives with his mother, stepfather, and half-brother, whom his stepfather always favors. They recently moved from Prague to the countryside, so he's not popular at school either. His best friend is Honza Dvořák – known as Dvořka. The main character, who has never stood out in sports, among classmates or in his family, is trying to shine. Dom is not afraid to dream big dreams. His goal is to gain recognition and a kiss from Káťa, the most beautiful girl in class.




KÁŤA

11 years old, is the secret love of the main character, Dom, and primarily gives him the motivation for him to achieve something remarkable. Káťa is among the top students in her class. She always looks shy and full of mysteries. She lives with her father in poor conditions.



DVOŘKA

11 years old, is Dom's best friend. You can always count on him. He faithfully supports Dom in all their antics and follows him in his journey towards his dreams. He is also the son of the former professional hockey player Karel Dvořák. He has a younger brother Aleš and an older sister Petra. His role model is Jaromír Jágr.



KAREL DVOŘÁK

45 years old, is a former professional hockey player, who is experiencing burnout. He feels that he could have achieved more in his career than he managed, and his frustration is reflected in his marriage, which is gradually failing. He has three children, his eldest daughter Petra, Doms best friend Honza, and youngest son Aleš. When he sees how hard the kids are trying to play sports and are eager to defeat the team of rivals from the neighboring village, he decides to help them in this task and starts coaching a team of children who have never played hockey before.



EVA

42 years old, is Dom's mother, who longs for a quiet and harmonious family. Unfortunately, the relationships between her son and her new husband, who also prefers his own son, are complicated. As such, she often has to choose between the love and support of her son and the peace in her marriage. She gradually realizes that there is much more to Dom than everyone thinks.



GRANDPA PEPÍK

60 years old, is Dom's only real defender. He takes care of injured or sick animals in the countryside or at home. He is knowledgeable about sports and always tries to motivate Dom positively. At one time he was a hockey goalie, but that was a long time ago.



MILAN

43 years old, is Dom's stepfather, who is convinced that Dom will never achieve anything in life because he's not manually skilled. He constantly compares him to his son Jirka, who seems to excel at everything. He owns a pub in the village.

DIRECTOR'S PROFILE



The director of Children of Nagano, Dan Pánek, debuted in 2016 with the independent film "Taxi 121" and continued to create the internet serial hit "Behind the Curtain".

During the years of the pandemic, he co-founded the film production company Visual Riders s.r.o., which he intends to use in his future work.

Dan Pánek is also a commercial director. He directed the KVIFF spot for the investment holding Progresus. In 2023, his second feature film "Children of Nagano" premiered. Image: Photo of Dan.

FILM RECEPTION BY VIEWERS

After favorable reviews and great viewer responses in cinemas, Children of Nagano topped Netflix.

The film was the absolute number one for a week, and for the next two weeks, it stayed among the top 10 films.

The film received very positive responses at the Zlín Film Festival.

Big Dreams is also one of the 3 most ordered films for summer cinemas in the Czech Republic.

BIG DREAMS ABROAD

The film was released in cinemas in Slovakia and will follow on TV.


Big Dreams also found favor in Poland, where the film is headed for cinemasand then TV and VOD platforms.

The premiere of the film for the Benelux countries will take place at the Filem'On - Brussels Children's Film Festival. The Austrian premiere of the film will be held at the Vienna International Children's Film Festival.

We are equally pleased with the interest of the Kineko International Film Festival, and the film will have its Asian premiere in Tokyo in September.

In September, the film will also have its German premiere at the Schlingel Iff Children's and Youth Film Festival in Chemnitz, Finále Pilsen Czech Republic, Olympia Greece FF, Taiwan FF, Cottbus Film Festival.

And gradually, more festivals and distributors are showing interest in the film, Big Dreams.
